



In order to meet the requirements of the Oregon Forest Practices Act, Section 629-605-170, Weyerhaeuser submits the following plan for operation within 100 feet of type F streams.

Operation: Timber Harvest (clear cut) & Rock Pit Development

Unit Name: Mosby 1700 Pit

Location: Section 26, T22S, R2W

Notification Number: Submitted concurrently with Written Plan.

Protected Resource: Table Rock Creek (MF)

Narrative: In this operation Weyerhaeuser will harvest a unit that borders approximately 800 feet of Table Rock Creek (MF). A 30 to 50 foot, no touch buffer strip was marked in the field on all portions of the MF stream, no harvest activity will taking place within the flagged portion of the RMA. The basal area within flagged portions of the MF streams did meet the active basal area requirements on this unit.

Cutting: All cutting will be done to protect the flagged portions of the RMAs.

Harvest operations: Harvest operations should have minimal impact on the streams. No harvest activity will take place within the flagged portion of the MF streams. Areas where tracked type machinery operate will be water-barred and re-habbed as necessary to facilitate soil drainage. During harvest operations, existing ditches and culverts will be kept free of any obstructions that could divert water from its proper course. Upon completion of the harvest unit any temporary dirt roads built into the unit will be water-barred and blocked prior to fall rains.

Rock Pit & Stockpile Development: Stockpile and rock pit development will not take place within the flagged portion of the RMA. All excavated materials including slash and stumps associated with this development will be piled outside of the flagged portion of the RMA to be burned this fall. Piles and concentrated slash may be burned within 100 feet of the high water line. Burning will be done following fall rain to protect the RMA

vegetation and leave trees. Surface runoff from the rock pit and associated stockpile sites will be managed as to not be allowed to flow directly into Table Rock Creek (MF).

Mechanical Site Preparation: Mechanical site preparation activities may occur within 100' of the fish or domestic type stream as shown on the attached map. Excavator piling of slash and brush may occur on slopes less than 40% and within the RMA. All machine activity will be conducted 20' or greater from the high water line of the streams. Machine activity will be kept to a minimum near small side streams and wet areas feeding directly into fish and domestic streams. Slash accumulations will be piled away from the buffer and trees retained within the RMAs, to minimize heat damage when they are burned. Large woody debris material within 50' of the stream will be left within the RMA.
