

Dear Paul,

In order to meet the requirements of the Oregon Forest Practices Act, Section 629-605-173(5)(b), Weyerhaeuser submits an alternate plan for operation within 100 feet of type D streams.

Operation: Timber Harvest (clear cut)

Unit Name: Horton Store

Location: NW ¼, NE ¼, section 34, T. 15S., R. 7W.

Protected Resource: Small domestic stream.

Narrative: In this operation Weyerhaeuser will harvest a unit that has a small domestic stream within the unit. Half of the distance of the drainage equals 375, however 408' feet of stream has been buffered, which is just below end of perennial surface flow. A 20' buffer has been flagged with pink "wildlife" tied with bluc/white stripe ribbon to protect non-merchantable vegetation.

Due to the location of this buffer, there is a high probability of wind-throw should any trees be left on this ridge-top. Trees that may blow down within this buffer area have a high probability of degrading water quality due to disturbance of the stream channel from root wads and trees laying across or into the channel. At this time Weyerhaeuser proposes to cut and remove any trees greater than 12" DBH within this flagged buffer to minimize the detrimental impacts of wind-throw. Trees less than 12" DBH will be left and non-merchantable vegetation will be protected during the cutting and logging operations.

Cutting: Felling will be done in a manner that minimizes damage to trees and vegetation retained in the buffers. Conifer trees within a tree length of the posted buffers will be felled parallel to, or away from the buffers. Trees within the buffer area will also be felled away from the stream channel. Because of safety concerns, hardwoods may be felled in the direction they lean. Hardwoods felled into the stream channel or RMA will be bucked and yarded in such a manner that minimizes additional disturbance to the RMA and/or stream channel.

Harvest operations: Harvest operations should have minimal impact on the streams. Lines may be hung through the RMAs for lift, and any logs yarded will be yarded away from the stream channel. Any lines hung through RMAs will be positioned for minimal impact on the RMAs. All road changes done while lines are hung through RMAs will be done with lines re-spooled and re-strung rather than si-washed across. Areas where tracked type machinery operate will be water-barred and re-habbed as necessary to facilitate soil drainage. Trees may be removed from this posted buffer area by logging away from the stream channel.

High Landslide Hazard Locations:- At this time Weyerhacuser requests a waiver of written plan regarding harvest on HLHL within this unit, as a field visit with ODF staff has verified that no operations will take place on HLHL.

Site Preparation: Machine piling of slash and brush may occur on slopes less than 40% and within the domestic water source RMA. Ground disturbance will be minimized within the RMA and all machine activities with slash piling will be greater than 20 feet from the high water line. Slash accumulations will be piled away from trees retained in the buffers to minimize heat damage when they are burned.
