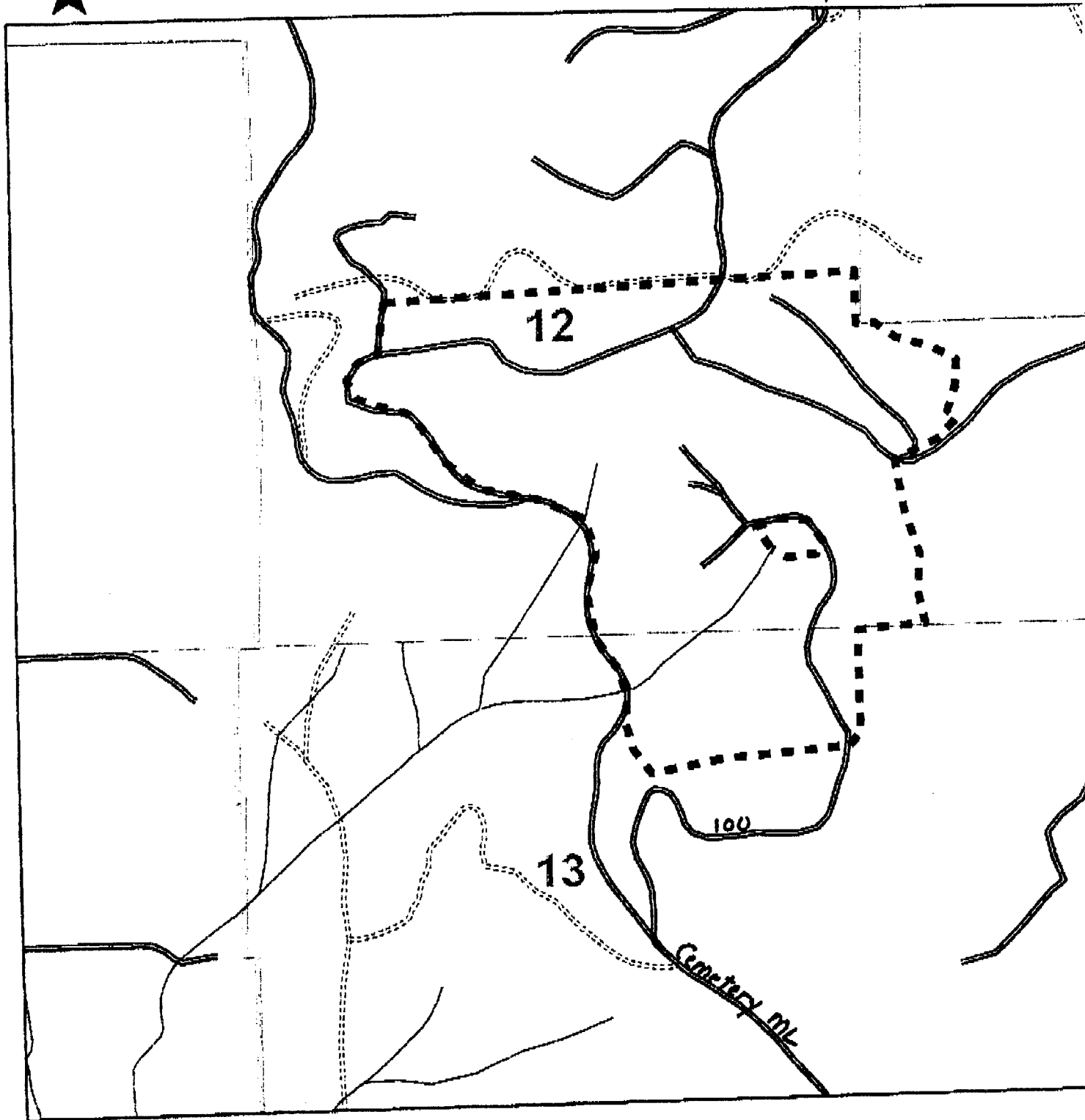

- Enhance the Fire Investigator level II & III pool on the District. Identify the needs, provide required training and practical field experience opportunities to gain experience and maintain currency.
- Develop a plan to assure that Forest Officers are familiar with the locations of Moderate and High risk industrial operations within their patrol areas.
- Set expectations for the use of Prevention logs by Forest Officers and their return within specific time frames.
- Promote “meet and greet” opportunities with landowners at the beginning of the season to familiarize the Forest Officers with Cooperators within their patrol areas.

## **Suppression**

- Continue to stress the importance of the issuance of Record of Fire Condition on all human cause fires that a responsible party is known to the Initial Attack IC.
- Continue to emphasize the importance of timely and concise fire size – up intelligence and communications with the dispatch.
- Continue to emphasize the 24 – 48- 72 hour and fire checks and patrol status and the associated documentation process.
- Continue to stress the importance following dispatch response protocol upon receipt of a fire dispatch. This is done to provide for safety and the efficient use of resources.

## **Safety / Wellness**

- Continue to initiate After Action Reviews as needed to enhance and solidify our suppression actions.
- Conduct weekly safety meetings and reviews. Initiate tail gate safety briefings prior to commencing work projects or as needed. Educate suppression personnel on the daily fire indices (NFDRS), 6 minutes for safety, summaries of AAR’s, lessons learned.
- As an education tool, quiz personnel on NFDRS daily dispatch readings, weather, red flag warnings, tactics, strategies, contents of Safety Plans, contents of Fire Mobilization Plans, content of Employee manuals.

## **Out of District Mobilization**

- Continue to be pro-active in pre-identifying IQS currency needs, personnel rotations for out of District Dispatches. Strive towards a quick and timely dispatch from the offices to aid the receiving district.
- Review and validate the district’s draw down analysis prior to the 08 fire season.

## **Buisness Management**

- Continue education and training in fire finance to include the use of shift tickets, hiring of AD workers (EEPR’s), hiring of equipment (ERA’s), time sheets, mileage logs and associated documentation.
  - Continue the use and make improvements to the Out of District packets.
  - Set clear expectations and review and sign individual Position Descriptions, review pertinent District and Agency policies.
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
