



In order to meet the requirements of the Oregon Forest Practices Act, Section 629-605-170, Weyerhaeuser submits the following plan for operation within 100 feet of type F streams.

Operation: Timber Harvest (clear cut)

Unit Name: Congdon Corner

Location: E 1/2, Section 28, T. 15S., R. 7W.

Protected Resource: Small, medium fish streams, tributary to Congdon Creek.

Narrative: In this operation Weyerhaeuser will harvest a unit that has a medium fish stream as the western boundary (tributary A) turning to a small fish stream (small fish tributary A) and a secondary small fish stream (tributary B). Medium fish trib. A is approximately 1600' feet in length. Basal area requirements were not met and a variablewidth buffer is flagged with pink "wildlife" ribbon tied with blue and white candy-striped ribbon. This buffer will retain all conifer within 70' of the high water level (HWL), all hardwood within 30' of the HWL., and all trees leaning over the channel. Small fish trib. A runs approximately 1100' through the unit, met basal area requirements, and a variable-width buffer is flagged with pink wildlife" ribbon tied with blue and white candy-striped ribbon. Small fish trib. B runs approximately 700 feet through the unit. Basal area requirements were not met on the east side. A variable-width buffer is flagged with pink "wildlife" ribbon tied with blue and white candy-striped ribbon. This buffer will retain all conifer within 50° of the HWL, all hardwood within 20° of the HWL., and all trees leaning over the channel. Basal area requirements were met on the west side of small fish trib. B. A variable-width buffer is flagged with pink "wildlife" ribbon tied with blue and white candy-striped ribbon.

Cutting: Felling will be done in a manner that minimizes damage to trees and vegetation retained in the buffers. Conifer trees within a tree length of the posted buffers will be felled parallel to, or away from the buffers. Because of safety concerns, hardwoods may be felled in the direction they lean. Hardwoods felled into the stream channel or RMA will be bucked and yarded in such a manner that minimizes additional disturbance to the

RMA and/or stream channel. If individual trees or snags required to be retained within the RMA need to be felled for safety reasons, when possible they may be directed toward the stream channel and left in place where they fall.

Harvest operations: A skyline yarding system that uses a slackpulling carriage will be used when yarding lines cross fish streams. All cable road changes will be made by respooling and restringing to the next tailhold. If yarding lines through the buffer require trees to be cut for safety reasons, the width should not exceed 10 feet on each side of the skyline location, and all cut trees will be left within the RMA. If logs are yarded over fish streams, full suspension will be required to minimize damage to the stream banks.

Site Preparation: Machine piling of slash and brush may occur on slopes less than 40% and within the RMAs. Ground disturbance will be minimized within the RMA and all machine activities with slash piling will be greater than 10 feet from the high water line. Slash accumulations will be piled away from trees retained in the buffers to minimize heat damage when they are burned.
