

WRITTEN PLAN

All chemical application rules specified in the Oregon Forest Practices Act will be adhered to. A buffer strip parallel to each fish bearing or domestic stream will be left to protect water from the direct application of chemicals. Protected resources will be reviewed with the application prior to application. A Company Forester will be nearby to munitor weather. Additional Mitigating Measures:

- Trees remaining from harvest operations and targeted for treatment are in excess of the riparian and leave tree requirements.
- The helicopter used for applying herbicides to Roseburg Resources plantations will be equipped with and may implement a unique half boom shutoff system which can limit the swath width to approximately 25 feet, and will more accurately align the swath edge under the center of the helicopter while reducing drift. This system will be implemented in areas where site and environmental conditions (terrain, weather, RMA width, etc.) dictate the need for additional protection measures.
- Application will comply with all regulations pertaining to seasonal and temporal restrictions around the identified wildlife resource site.
- No hand application will be done within 10' of the aquetic arrea of the identified stream.
